They are linking this to our 9 Gospel Values.

#### Catholic Social Teaching

We have been learning about the importance of Catholic Social Teaching in our lives. Our 9 Gospel Values are the bedrock of our school and what we would like the children to show to others. There are 7 principles of Catholic Social Teaching and these underpin our Gospel Values. The Gospel values are the golden threads that weave through all that we do at Holy Cross and the Catholic Social Teaching principles are the silver threads that run from the Gospel Values. Our first board as everyone comes through into our school, shows this.

Human Dignity is the cornerstone of these principles and the children have been learning about this, this week. We want our pupils to think about others and the dignity of human life as we are all made in the likeness of God and should therefore reflect this to others through our words and actions. #### Based on the gospel for Sunday 2 July, Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Matthew 10:37-42

"Anyone who welcomes you, welcomes me; and those who welcome me welcome the one who sent me."

Jesus' instructions are not easy. He lares bare for the disciples that they may be called to choose him even above their own family. That they will face challenges and may even lose their life.

This is a scary prospect. It takes a particular sort of courage to stand up for what we believe in, and not quietly back down when things get tough. How prepared are we really to pick up our cross and follow Jesus?

Jesus goes on to promise a reward for those who welcome his disciples. This is a further challenge, when the messages we hear in so many places today are about what divide us.

Do we open ourselves to those who seek a welcome in our community, or in our country? Those who are fleeing conflict, persecution or poverty? Those who might have a different opinion to us or who open our eyes to the need for change?

Let us hold onto the idea that in welcoming others, we are welcoming Christ, and seek the courage to follow in his way.

Loving God, open our hearts to welcome you in all our sisters and brothers. Grant us the courage to answer your call in our lives each day. Amen.

#### Dear Parents and Carers,




#### Wednesday 28th June 2023

#### e gospel in church Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2023



Jesus instructed the twelve as follows: "Anyone who prefers father or mother to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who prefers son or daughter to me in not worthy of me. Anyone who does not

take his cross and follow in my footsteps is not worthy of me. Anyone who finds his life will lose it; anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me; and those who welcome me welcome the one who sent me. Anyone who welcomes a prophet because he is a prophet will have a prophet's reward; and anyone who welcomes a holy man because he is a holy man will have a holy man's reward. If anyone gives so much as a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is a disciple, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward."


#### Our Special Time Together

#### Selfless people make the world a much better place.

Word is ....

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Ask your child what the word 'selfless' means to them. Being 'selfless' is the opposite of being 'selfish'. It is about being very aware of others' needs or interests, and putting them before our own. Who are the most selfless people that your child knows - that is, people who put others' needs first? Why did they think of those people? It may help your child if you can talk about a historical figure or someone you know who can be described as selfless. What is it like to be in the company of a selfless person?

To love God, we must be selfless. As a family, talk about how you can selflessly follow Jesus and serve others in this coming week, even in little ways, at home, at school or in the community. Dear Lord Jesus, thank you for the example of many selfless people who show us your way of love and kindness. Please help us to be selfless like them. Amen.


