


Funky Fingers:




The natural world:



At Holy Cross we follow the systematic synthetic phonics scheme called 'Little Wandle Letters and Sounds'. The big focus during the Spring term is to learn and apply the Phase 3 digraphs to reading and spelling.



Literacy- Reading and writing

Sounds

We will be learning these sounds (phonemes) linking each sound to the letters (grapheme). We will learn that a digraph is 'two letters, one sound'. We will also be learning the capital letter than corresponds with the sound, and will begin to match and recognise when these are needed. We will continue to learn a handwriting rhyme for each letter to help with letter formation during planned handwriting sessions.

We will use our phonics knowledge to read and write phrases and complete sentences, made up of CVC and CVCC words. We will recognise that we need to leave spaces between words. We will record a piece of literacy work each week,

in children's individual exercise books.

Tricky words: These are words that you cannot sound out, they have a tricky part- for example: said. The tricky part is the 'ai' making the 'e' sound.

Relationships

We will support the children to continue to form good relationships and we will support them to use kind words in order to support their friends. We will encourage team work.







Feelings

Children will express their feelings. They will use our class emotions board and will share how and why they feel a particular way.

Rules

Children will help to suggest and create rules for new activities. They will begin to consider why we may need some rules.

JIGSAW

We follow a scheme called Jigsaw to focus on PSHE, which links to PSED in EYFS. This half terms topic is, 'Dreams and Goals'. The children will set goals for themselves, beginning with a New Year Goal/Resolution, and they will work towards it. Children will know that if you persevere you can tackle challenges.
