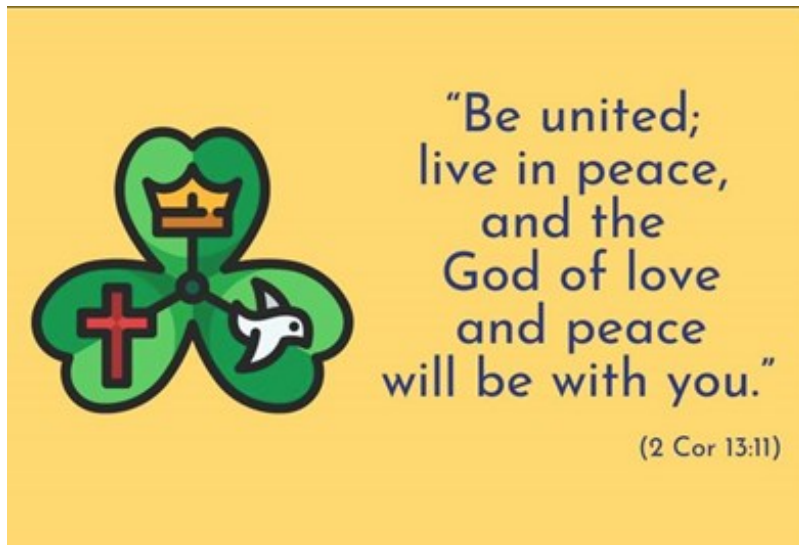


GOSPEL VALUE: Our Gospel Value for next week is Peace. Please reflect on this at home with your child.

Sports Week

The children will be taking part in Sports Week, next week. Please ensure that the children have clean PE kit for each of the days when they will be taking part in activities. Children should wear **house colours** on Wednesday and please see the note that Mrs Slater about the Colour Run on Thursday.

Wednesday Sports Morning and Summer Picnic (Fete)

A reminder that we will be having our traditional Sports Day races in the morning on Wednesday; Reception and Key Stage One will start at 9:15 and parents are welcome to go to the field after the children go in at the start of the day. Key Stage Two races will begin at 10:45. Parents can arrive for this from 10:30am. Please be aware that the gates will be closed for safeguarding reasons, when the children are on the field. You will not be able to leave during the races.

We will then continue the day with the Summer Picnic (Fete) in the afternoon from around 12 noon and we really hope that you can join us for the day or part of the day. You are welcome to bring a packed lunch which you can have on the field with your child but please remember that alcohol is not permitted and we ask that you go offsite to smoke. No dogs or animals are allowed on the school site.

Mrs Slater has sent out a programme for the week ahead and we ask that you read it so that you know what is happening every day.

PE Kit

We have sent a reminder out about our Holy Cross PE Kit. The bottoms do not have to have the school logo but they must be black tracksuit bottoms or black sports shorts. Leggings and cycling shorts are not permitted as part of the school PE kit. If your child wears these to school, they will not be allowed to take part in the PE lesson. Pupils are not permitted to have anything in their ears (plastic sleepers) when they take part in PE/ Sport.

Summer Uniform-Sun Safety

All children should now be wearing the summer uniform-not a shirt and tie. It is going to get hotter over the next few weeks so please ensure that your child has a hat (they will not be allowed outside without one), a refillable water bottle and sun cream applied at the beginning of every day. The children spend a lot of time outdoors this half term and it is very important that they are safe in the sun.

Appropriate Dress

As a catholic school we have a standard of dress that is clear through our uniform policy. When we have a non-uniform day or when children take part in offsite activities where they wear their own clothes, clothes must remain appropriate. I am especially concerned about the shortness of pupils' shorts and skirts and some items are also very tight fitting. If I feel that your child is not appropriately dressed for the school day, either on site or offsite you will be called to bring them a change of clothes.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Please ensure you are sending your child into school everyday, unless they are not well enough to attend. Attending school is so important and makes a huge difference to your child's learning. The gates open at 8:30am until 8.50am.

It is essential you notify us of your child's absence by 9am either by telephone or using the Arbor report absence option on every day of absence. We need full details of why your child is unable to attend school. We are frequently having to contact parents, to find out why their child is absent from school. If you do not notify us of the reason for your child's absence it may not be authorised.

Absences over 3 days require supporting medical evidence, for the additional absence to be authorised. Medical evidence can take the form of prescriptions, antibiotics and medical appointments.

Parents of children below attendance targets will be invited in for a meeting with the Educational Welfare Officer.

"When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you to the truth."

Jesus speaks to his disciples, promising someone who will walk alongside them when they're ready to understand more. On the Feast of the Holy Trinity, we celebrate God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit: a relationship of love, unity and equality. This is not just a matter of theology - it's also a model for how we live with one another.

The Trinity shows us that love is always about relationship. It's not 'all about us', but about reaching out, staying connected, and lifting each other up. As Jesus reminds us, we're called to go beyond the obvious connections of family and friends. This can mean standing up for those who are overlooked or excluded, speaking truth even when it's uncomfortable, and insisting everyone is treated with dignity.

The Spirit comforts us - but also challenges us. It nudges us towards justice, opens our eyes to those who are hurting, and calls us to care enough to act. The Holy Trinity isn't a mystery to solve - it's a pattern to follow: a life of love, truth and unity.

So today, maybe we ask ourselves: how might we live more like that divine relationship? How can we love like God - treasuring others and rejoicing in community?

Reflect

After reading the Gospel, did any words stand out? If they did, ponder or discuss them before proceeding with the reflection.

After spending a few minutes considering this Gospel, continue by reading Fr Henry Wansbrough's reflection.

We can learn a little about the Trinity from this passage. Think of a perfect relationship between a father and a son: complete understanding between them - loving care from the father, loving obedience from the son; complete support from both sides. As soon as one has an idea, the other expresses it, to the perfect satisfaction of the first. As soon as one starts an action, the other has completed it, to the delight of the first. Then the son sends his own spirit, which is not himself, but represents himself fully, makes him present when he is not there and does his work exactly as he would do it. Two other images, perhaps rather cheeky: three men on a bench outside a pub or three women with supermarket trolleys, all three chatting in perfect harmony and understanding, with complete exchange of ideas and plenty of humour, laughter and warmth. Their friendship is so attractive that you would love to join them but don't dare. They are so welcoming that they seem to invite you to join them. They are so loving that you feel you have found happiness as never before. These are rather wretched images, straining to express the unity in diversity of the Trinity, but one must at least try to understand. Read the gospel again! Can you think of an image for the Trinity, three Persons in one Nature?

Fr Henry's reflections on the first and second readings of **Sunday 15th June 2025**



1st Reading: Proverbs 8:22-31

The Wisdom of God

The Wisdom of God cries aloud: "The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded, before the oldest of his works. From everlasting I was firmly set, from the beginning, before earth came into being. The deep was not, when I was born; there were no springs to gush with water. Before the mountains were settled, before the hills, I came to birth; before he made the earth, the countryside, or the first grains of the world's dust. When he fixed the heavens firm, I was there, when he drew a ring on the surface of the deep, when he thickened the clouds above, when he fixed fast the springs of the deep, when he assigned the sea its boundaries - and the waters will not invade the shore - when he laid down the foundations of the earth, I was by his side, a master craftsman, delighting him day after day, ever at play in his presence, at play everywhere in his world, delighting to be with the sons of men."

How did we Christians come to see God as a Trinity of Persons? With a noble sense of reverence the Israelites saw God as so infinitely other than the world that it became difficult to understand how God could mix with the world, even how God could 'dirty his fingers' by creating the world. The solution was that God must have created the universe by his Wisdom, the 'master craftsman' by his side in the work of creation. God's Wisdom is in a way the same as God, but yet not exactly the same. But is God's Wisdom itself created? It is not clear whether God 'created' or 'possessed' Wisdom, for the Hebrew word, is given both senses by different ancient translators. So there is in God something which both is God and is not the same as the Creator. The Wisdom of God is also similar to the Word of God by which God created ('He spoke and it came into being,' it says in the Creation Story in Genesis 1). In the New Testament Jesus is known both as the Wisdom of God and as the Word of God. The first thing we know about God is that we cannot fully know God. Nevertheless, texts (like this one from Proverbs) indicate a groping towards the idea that there is diversity within God. Here we find something of the origins of our understanding of the Trinity.

'God is love.' But if God is totally other, what can this mean?



2nd Reading: Romans 5:1-5

The Three Persons at Work

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, by faith we are judged righteous and at peace with God, since it is by faith and through Jesus that we have entered this state of grace in which we can boast about looking forward to God's glory. But that is not all we can boast about; we can boast about our sufferings. These sufferings bring patience, as we know, and patience brings perseverance, and perseverance brings hope, and this hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us.

When Paul wrote his letter to the Romans the theology of the Trinity was still waiting to be worked out. The interrelationship between the three Persons did not begin to be elaborated by theologians for a couple of centuries yet, nor what is meant by calling them 'persons'. Paul does call the Risen Christ 'LORD', using the sacred name which may be used only of God. Moreover, he shows an awareness that three different modes are involved in human salvation, the divine action which brings human beings back to God. He often has a triple formula like the one in this reading, using different language of God, Christ and the Spirit. Through our LORD Jesus Christ we are brought into peace with God, and the love of God is poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit. Human language is so totally inadequate to express truths about God that it will take a long time before any satisfying formula is found.

Can we distinguish the function of the three Persons of the Trinity in the work of our salvation?


