Holy Cross School Council visit Streets2Homes


On Thursday members of the School Council visited the Streets2Homes shelter. They were welcomed by Will who told the children how much the food donated by Holy Cross, through the Harvest Festival Appeal, was appreciated.

As he showed the children around, Will told the children about the work that they do. In the last year, Streets2 Homes have provided 1,900 breakfasts and 4,620 lunches. They supported

425 new people, have been successful in housing 72 and provided 182 house support visits.

Will himself was homeless this time last year. Through the support of this charity he is now housed and has secured a role as co-ordinator at Streets2Homes.

As you can see this charity really does great work supporting homeless people in Harlow. Not only do they provide food and shelter during the day but also help those who are homeless apply for work to help them on their way to becoming self-sufficient. We as a community at Holy Cross are very pleased to have been able to help them with their cause.
